SKILLS PROGRAMMES

Short duration skills-based programmes offered by TVET Colleges, usually from rurally located skills campuses. The Occupational Programme Unit is in charge to the skills training programmes offered by Mthashana College.

7 LEARNERSHIPS



TVET PROGRAMMES STRUCTURE


PRE-VOCATIONAL LEARNING PROGRAMME (PLP)





COURSE TYPE: NATIONAL CERTIFICATE (VOCATIONAL) NC (V)

WHAT IS NC (V)

The National Certificate (Vocational) is a new set of national qualifications designed to provide people with a high level of marketable skills. Each of the programmes provides in-depth knowledge in its specific field, opening doors to NC (V) graduates in a range of occupations within its specific field.

HOW LONG DOES IT TAKE?

3 Years (1 year per level). Each of the 3 NC (V) levels currently offered take 1 year to complete. Ideally students should complete all 3 levels.

WHICH QUALIFICATION /
CERTIFICATE DOES A LEARNER
OBTAIN ON COMPLETION?

Full Certificates on NQF Level 2, 3 and 4 NC(V) Level 4 Certificate is equivalent to National Senior Certificate (matric)

WHO IS NC (V) FOR?

NC (V) is for anyone who want to gain the knowledge and practical skills necessary to assess their dreams career. The minimum entry requirement is Grade 9/NQF L1 Qualification + college requirements set per programme. The programme is very challenging and is well suited to with higher qualifications who want to access a specific field.

3 Years (18 months theoretical studies + 24 months Engineering workplace application) for N4 – N6 Business and Utility Studies 12 months for N4 – N6 Engineering Studies

WORK PLACEMENT OFFICE (PLACEMENT OF STUDENTS)

- The work placement office assist both Report 191 and NCV students to obtain the necessary
 practical experience they need. However, this does not relieve students of the responsibility
 for finding a suitable host company.
- In order for the placement office to place Report 1910R Level 4 students, they must have passed all their modules. This application does not apply for engineering students as they can be placed from N2 up to N6 for skills programs. Student must submit his/her CV to the placement office.
- NCV level 4 students are also given the opportunity for experiential learning over a period of 5/10 days. All level 4 WBE be placed according to the program to be placed on that particular year.
- The college does not have a budget to pay a stipend to all students who are placed for the in-service training. Students receive a stipend if the college has been awarded funding from the Seta's.
- An agreement must be signed between the college, the student, the SETA and host employer. This agreement must outline the responsibilities of all parties.
